

Alumni Spotlight: Kawanna Leggett _{M.Ed., 2004}



Dr. Kawanna Leggett is a 2004 graduate of the HIED M.Ed. program and now works as the Senior Vice President for Student Affairs at Loyola Marymount University (LMU). Leggett was appointed to her new post in June 2022. She says it's been a wonderful transition. Prior to her current role, Leggett spent five years at Washington University in St. Louis where she was the Associate Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs.


When reflecting on her time in the M.Ed. program, Leggett noted that her favorite memory from her graduate school experience was being part of a cohort. She mentioned that it was truly amazing to meet, work, and learn with numerous professionals who are still in the field.

Leggett added that the cohort-based program meant that students had different assistantships across campus, and that this unique characteristic made both learning in the classroom and on the job a rich experience. She appreciated the support from her cohort who became friends and peers. Leggett also enjoyed her classroom experience with well-known professors. She distinctly remembers Lyle Gohn, Michael Miller, Christopher Lucas, and many other professionals who helped guide her through the program. She remembers well how knowledgeable professors were in their areas of expertise, which contributed to both a sense of student support and motivation throughout the program. As a program alum, Leggett said she always looks back on her time in Arkansas fondly. She thinks of Arkansas, particularly Fayetteville, as a hidden gem and thoroughly enjoyed the many opportunities the region had to offer.

During her time in the program, Leggett stayed motivated by remembering her calling to work in higher education and provide better support for students. She learned to balance being a student and being a student affairs professional. She worked in student housing, an area that later became her career for 20+ years. Leggett also noted that the theoretical background she got from her classes has served her well over the years, enabling her to do student affairs work better.

One class that had the most impact on Leggett's professional career, which also happened to be her favorite course, was Dr. Miller's Management course. She said his energy and focus on engagement in higher education and the corporate setting helped her understand the key elements of management, including how to be a good leader. Leggett still uses the foundations learned in Dr. Miller's course today, reflecting that the course gave her a keen eye toward leadership and equipped her with a wide variety of tools to grow as a leader and manager.

Leggett's advice to current HIED students is to give themselves grace. Graduate school often seems overwhelming, especially while holding an assistantship or full-time job. Leggett recommends taking the graduate school journey one day at a time and enjoying the experience, including getting outside of the classroom and being a student by making friends, attending campus events like homecoming, and getting involved.

As she begins her new role at Loyola Marymount University, Leggett is excited to build momentum for the future of her division by creating vision, setting goals, and recruiting new team members. She wants to be able to have an impact not only at LMU but broadly across higher education and student affairs industry. Getting involved in regional and national associations and attending conferences is part of her plan to give back to the profession.





Alumni Spotlight: Randall Brumfield Ed.D., 2007



Dr. Randall Brumfield serves as the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs for the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission. In this dual role, he shares his time with the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education. He completed his Ed.D. at the University of Arkansas in 2007.

When reflecting on his time in the program, Brumfield fondly recalled the HIED Governance and Policy class he took with Dr. Miller at the beginning of his program as one of the highlights of his educational journey. The course had a lasting impact on his career.

In the class, he recalled tracking an issue at the time called the "C Rule", which only allowed courses with final grades of C of higher to be transferred. This project, as well as putting together a meaningful literature review and doing original research, contributed to Brumfield's passion for governance and policy. Brumfield also enjoyed the HIED History and Philosophy class with Dr. Lucas. He said Dr. Lucas brought energy to the classroom and he learned valuable information about the roots of higher education dating back to the Greek era.

During his time in the program, Brumfield stayed intrinsically and extrinsically motived. He had a strong internal drive to finish the program, not wanting to finish "A.B.D." ("all but dissertation"). He also wanted to finish the program for his wife. Brumfield said she supported and motivated him by giving him the luxury to work on assignments while she helped care for their infant child. He didn't want to let her or other people down by not completing his degree. Another important source of motivation and encouragement for Brumfield was Dr. Miller, whom he would not have completed the program without.

Brumfield's advice to HIED students is to benefit from the dialogue in class with their professors and colleagues and to try to take that classroom knowledge and apply it as a practitioner at work. He recommends harnessing students' passion for student affairs work and bringing it to the classroom.

In his current role, Brumfield has big plans for the future. Right now, he is in the process of working with the Chancellor of the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission to develop state policies that will hopefully make a difference for student success in the state of West Virginia.

Alumni Spotlight: Kayla Loper M.Ed., 2014



Dr. Kayla Loper is currently the Associate Director of Leadership & Campus Life at Oklahoma State University (OSU) where she leads programs, staff, initiatives, and research aimed at understanding and increasing sense of belonging among OSU students.

A 2014 graduate of the HIED M.Ed. program, Loper said one of her favorite memories at the University of Arkansas was when her adult kickball team, THE Overachievers, lost the Toilet Bowl championship game, which truly meant they won the whole thing as the ultimate losers! Loper added that it was so fun and that the team had so many members even through they weren't very good at kickball.

Loper stayed motivated during her time as a student by building relationships with her students. She loved all the students she had the opportunity to advise through her assistantship in New Student & Family Programs. Loper has always been very passionate about making a difference as an administrative leader in higher education and having those formative relationships with students motivated her to continue work because her students deserved it.

When asked about which class had the greatest impact on her educational journey, Loper mentioned a specific assignment that she will never forget from Dr. Hevel's Student Development Theory class. Students picked a movie off a list to watch and then applied student development theory to the characters. Loper chose the movie "Mona Lisa Smile" and said that watching the movie was an extremely validating experience. Loper believes many of the themes in that movie have influenced her work in higher education in ways she hasn't even fully realized yet.

Loper advises current HIED students to explore a variety of focus and functional areas in higher education while they can through internships, assistantships, and class assignments. She said, "You never know what doors might open or what life circumstances you might encounter that require you to make an unexpected shift!"

Loper graduated in May 2022 with her Ph.D. in Educational Psychology from OSU and was promoted to her current role of Associate Director in July. Eventually, she'd like to assume a faculty role and teach higher education or quantitative research methods courses.


