



### CHRISTINA M. SMITH

HIGHER EDUCATION ADMINISTRATION - DOCTORAL PROGRAM; FALL 2021 GRADUATION



Dr. Christina M. Smith joined The University of Texas at Austin in June 2021, and she serves as senior director of development, principal gifts, for Dell Medical School and UT Health Austin.

Previously, Smith served for six years as a major gifts officer within the University of Arkansas System, first in the College of Social Sciences and Communication at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, and most recently at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, Arkansas' only academic medical center. While at the University of Arkansas System, Smith secured major gifts to advance new health care initiatives, research and education, with a particular focus on rural access to health care and the creation of a family medicine residency program and pathway for underserved communities.

She earned her bachelor's degree in political science from the University of Tulsa and her master's in public administration from the University of Oklahoma. She completed her doctorate in higher education the University of Arkansas.

A 2021 graduate of the HIED doctoral program, Christina's favorite memory from her graduate school experience at Arkansas is having Dr. Michael Miller serve as her dissertation chair and advisor. Dr. Miller's kind and consistent motivation was exactly the fuel that Christina needed to successfully write, defend, and confidently pass her exams and complete all the many requirements for her graduation from the program. It's expert ability to both push and empower Christina to do her very best and overcome many adversities is a treasured memory and what makes him one of the best professors she has ever been fortunate enough to learn from.

Interestingly, Dr. Miller was able to connect Christina with Chloe Jones, a May 2022 HIED M.Ed. graduate from Arkansas, as Chloe moved from Fayetteville, AR back to her hometown of Austin, TX after her master's graduation. Thanks to this connection, Christina and Chloe now work together on the same development team at the University of Texas' Dell Medical School: two Razorbacks in a sea of burnt orange!

### DR. JOSÉ G. RICARDO-OSORIO

#### MA (2001) IN SPANISH AND EDD (2006) IN HIGHER EDUCATION

Dr. José Ricardo serves as the acting dean in the College of Education and Human Services at Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania where he is also an Associate Professor of Foreign Language Education, and Spanish. Prior to serving as acting dean, Dr. José Ricardo was the interim Associate Dean for the college. For nine years, he held the chair position in the Department of Global Languages and Cultures in the College of Arts and Sciences at the same institution.

For José Ricardo, one of his favorite memories from the HIED program was the opportunity to diversify his program of study with courses from Curriculum & Instruction and the interactions that he had with a diverse group of graduate students when taking these courses.

José was a member of the International Culture Team (ICT) and he enjoyed sharing his culture through interactive presentations as well as dancing and singing at local schools, and on campus. The ICT named its Best Presenter Award after José Ricardo to recognize his contribution to the ICT.

## FELLOWS SELECTED

The Southeastern Conference (SEC) offers a program to develop current and future leaders in higher education. This competitive-entry program brings together several future leaders from each SEC institution to participate in campus visits as well as learning about the past, present, and future of higher education. This year's selection from the University of Arkansas had a strong Higher Education program representation, as Associate Professor Michael Hevel and doctoral student Adriana Gonzalez were selected from UA.



Dr. Hevel is currently serving as the Associate Dean of the College of Education and Health Professions and Adriana Gonzalez holds an MLS and is currently the Associate Dean of Libraries while she finishes her PhD in Higher Education. The SEC cohort recently began their year of study and classes with a site visit to Texas A&M University.

### SCHOLARSHIP

Higher Education alumna Caley Satterfield created the Dr. Billy Satterfield Memorial Scholarship in memory of her late husband and fellow alum, Billy Satterfield. The endowment was created to support graduate students in the Higher Education program, and the initial award was presented to doctoral student Aubree Huggart.

Billy was a two degree graduate of UA, earning both his masters and doctoral degrees in Higher Education. His 2007 dissertation explored the research priorities in financial aid. He worked in the Office of Financial Aid at UA while in school before moving to the University of Houston-Clear Lake where he served as the Executive Director of Financial Aid and Registrar. He then became a Senior Consultant for Deloitte Consulting, specializing in software implementation and policy development. He was killed by a drunk driver in 2019.

Billy and Caley were avid scuba divers and Billy also held his pilot's license.
